FOUNDED

USF is a private, Catholic university founded in 1920 by the Sisters of St. Francis of Mary Immaculate (Joliet Franciscans).

LOCATION

USF's main campus is located 35 miles southwest of Chicago in Joliet, Illinois. The campus is situated in the historic Cathedral Area on the west side of the city. Joliet is easily accessible by major interstates (I-55 & I-80), by rail and by air through Chicago's Midway and O'Hare Airports.

CAMPUS SPACES

The **Main Campus** sits on approximately 24 acres in a residential area. There are seven major buildings on this campus that contain classrooms, labs, meeting rooms, offices, student residences, library services, recreational facilities, dining options, theater spaces, a chapel, the bookstore and more.

The **St. Clare Campus** is located less than two miles northwest of the main campus. This campus houses administrative offices and is home to state-of-the-art nursing facilities and classrooms. Finally, the **St. Bonaventure Campus** in downtown Joliet includes the Robert W. Plaster Free Enterprise Center, which supports programs from the College of Arts & Sciences and the College of Business & Health Administration, and the USF Art & Design department and USF Gallery across the street. USF also operates a campus in Albuquerque, N.M. and offers satellite courses nationwide.
