CONSTITUTION

Responsible for reviewing constitutional issues as necessary. If changes are needed, this committee works to incorporate changes into the constitution which must be approved by the committee, Alumni Board, President's Designee, President, and Board of Trustees Chair.

NOMINATING & MEMBERSHIP

Each year, this committee shall nominate and prepare a slate of members to serve on the Alumni Board of Directors. This committee also selects up to three student representatives, as needed, to serve as liaisons representing the student body. They verify that all current members are meeting both attendance and giving requirements and suggest renewals and removals.

PROGRAMS

This committee has two subcommittees: Homecoming/Reunion and Engagement. The Homecoming/Reunion subcommittee is responsible for suggesting activities relating to the annual homecoming and reunion weekends of the alumni association. The Engagement subcommittee shall be responsible for all activities relating to events for parents/families, alumni outreach, events and travel offered to the Alumni Association.

SCHOLARSHIPS

This committee is responsible for the granting of alumni funds to students. They currently oversee the Visionary Leadership Award and Jane Engleton Snyder '35 Scholarship as well as administer interviews one weekend in March, which is a mandatory meeting for committee members.

Requirements

All members are required to attend 51% or more of the five regularly scheduled meetings per year in person or via conference call. Additionally, service on at least one committee, annual contribution to the Francis Scholarship Fund, and active support of alumni events and programs is expected. Members serve a three-year term.
