**After the first TB (Mantoux) is given, the second TB (Mantoux) must be administered no sooner than 7 days and within 3 weeks of the first test. (Public Health Title 77, Control of Tuberculosis Code Part 696)
 The IL Dept of Public Health requires that each new employee of a hospital have a record of a Mantoux test given within 90 days prior to or within 10 days after beginning employment. Nursing and Allied Health students must follow this policy since clinical participation at the hospital is an essential component of their program.

***Nursing students will be required to meet these requirements prior to starting clinical rotations. Students will begin meeting requirements during enrollment of **Course 250, Concept of Professional Nursing**.
