Why did you choose USF? USF was the nursing program associated with my school of nursing (Saint Joseph). When I decided to further my education, I wanted to attend USF because of the smaller classes and the excellent program taught by great instructors. USF prepared me for my very successful career in Nursing and Administration.

Who was your favorite professor and why? It would have to be Francis Lechrone, one of my nursing educators. She took a very sincere interest in her students and worked to produce very caring and competent nurses. She made learning interesting and participative.

What was your favorite class and why? I especially enjoyed the science classes. It is quite amazing to study the anatomy and physiology of the human body. It makes you think of the many unique processes that happen each day to each one of us in our daily routines that make us such superb specimens of the human race.

Have you stayed in touch with anyone from USF? Actually, I work closely with several of the nurses that graduated from USF at the Medical Center. We have a common bond. 
