If you are in the U.S. and have been granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA); an F-1 or F-2, or M-1 student visa, a J1 or J2 exchange visitor visa, or a G series visa (pertaining to international organizations), you do not qualify for federal student aid.

Upon receipt, our office will forward the documentation to the Department of Homeland Security to determine your eligibility for federal financial aid programs. Failure to submit eligible documentation will prevent you from receiving any Federal or State financial assistance.
